

Note:

- (i) The application Form submitted without deposition of the fee, which gets substantiated through reflection of the same on the application form, shall be treated as incomplete and candidature of such candidate shall be deemed to have been rejected without any notice. No representation against such rejection shall be entertained.
- (ii) Submission of multiple applications by way of prefixing Mr/Ms or through generation of multiple User ID's or any other mode, followed by either non-payment of fee particulars or fee particulars (TID) of one application (RID) being mentioned against another application with a different RID would lead to rejection of the online application. The applicants who are submitting multiple applications should note that only the applications with higher Registration ID (RID) number shall be entertained by the Commission and fee paid against one RID shall not be adjusted against any other RID number. Besides, a strict disciplinary action including the cancellation of candidature and debarment from appearance in future examinations of J&K PSC will be taken against such applicants.

8. Documents to be mandatorily uploaded

While filling the online application form, the applicant(s) are required to mandatorily upload the following documents alongwith the online application form:-

- i) Date of Birth Certificate (Secondary School/Matric certificate)- 1 leaf
- ii) Domicile certificate - 1 leaf
- iii) Category certificate (If claiming benefit under that category)- 1 leaf
- iv) B.V Sc & A.H Degree certificate alongwith the consolidated Marks Cards- upto 5 leaves.

NOTE

It may be noted that the Requisite Documents uploaded by the candidates must be issued before the prescribed cut of date of filing of the application forms and that no further opportunity shall be provided to upload any document and action under rules including rejection of application form/candidature etc. will be taken without any further notice.

9. Scheme of selection

- (i) In pursuance of SRO No. 546 dated 10.12.2018, the selection process shall be by written test only which shall be of graduation standard as far as practicable.
- (ii) The OMR based written examination will comprises of 120 MCQ/Objective type questions of one (01) mark each to be answered in two hours (120 minutes) on the basis of Syllabus mentioned in the notification.

(a) Each question will be followed by four (a,b,c,d) answer options. The candidate will have to encircle/blacken the option he/she thinks is right/correct on the OMR answer sheet with blue/black ball pen.

(b) There will be negative marking for incorrect answers for all questions as detailed below:-

(i) There are four options for the answer to every question. For each question for which wrong answer has been given by the candidate, one-fourth (0.25) of the marks assigned to that question will be deducted as penalty;

(ii) If the candidate gives more than one answer, it will be treated as a wrong answer even if one of the given answers happens to be correct and there will be same penalty as above for that question;

(iii) If a question is left blank i.e no answer is given by the candidate, there will be no penalty for that question.

It is further notified that :

i) No. of questions shall be 120 out of which 100 shall be on the subject matter (as per syllabus) and 20 questions on General Knowledge.

ii) Papers shall be in English.

10. The Syllabus for the Written Examination are as under:

Animal Husbandry:

1. General : Importance of livestock in Agriculture, Relationship between Plant and Animal Husbandry, Mixed farming Livestock and milk production statistics.

2. Genetics : Elements of genetics and breeding as applied to improvement of animals. Breeds of indigenous and exotic cattle, buffaloes, goats, sheeps, pigs and poultry and their potential of milk, eggs, meat and wool production.

3. Nutrition : Classification of feeds, feeding standards, computation of ration and mixing of rations, conservation of feeds and fodder.

4. Management : Management of livestock (Pregnant and milking cows, young stock), livestock records, principles of clean milk production, economies of livestock farming Livestock housing.

Veterinary Science

1. Major contagious diseases affecting cattle and drought animals, poultry and pigs.

2. Artificial insemination, fertility and sterility.

3. Veterinary hygiene with reference to water, air and habitation.

4. Principles of immunization and vaccination.

5. Description, symptoms, diagnosis and treatment of the following diseases of :

(a) Cattle: Anthrax, Foot and mouth disease, Haemorrhagic, Septicaemia, Rinderpest, Black quarter, Tympanitis, Diarrhoea, Pneumonia, Tuberculosis, Johnes disease and diseases of new born calf.

(b) Poultry : Coccidiosis, Ranikhet, Fowl Pox, Avian Leukosis, Marks Disease.

(c) Swine : Swine fever.

6. (a) Poisons used for killing animals.

(b) Drugs used for doping of race horses and the techniques of detection.

(c) Drugs used to tranquilize wild animals as well as animals in captivity.

(d) Quarantine measures prevalent in India and abroad and improvements therein

Dairy Science

1. Study of milk composition, physical properties and food value.

2. Quality control of milk, common tests, legal standards.

3. Utensils and equipment and their cleaning.

4. Organization of Dairy, processing of milk and distribution.

5. Manufacture of Indian indigenous milk products.

6. Simple dairy operations.


7. Micro-organisms found in milk and dairy products.

8. Diseases transmitted through milk to man.

B. Questions relating to General Knowledge

Questions on General Knowledge, shall comprise National Affairs, J&K Affairs and questions relevant to the subject.

11. Centre of Examination

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- I. The examination will be held at Srinagar & Jammu Centres. All the candidates shall indicate the option for examination centre as indicated above.
 - II. The allotment of centres shall be the sole discretion of the Commission and once a centre is allotted to a candidate, request for a change of centre will not be entertained.
